HUMAN HEALTH

- Anthrax Suspected in Kenya: **08 suspected cases** recorded in Ikolomani sub-county, Kakamega county, between 30 May and 20 June 2022.
- Poliovirus (cVDPV2) in Algeria: **01 case detected in a 1-year-old girl** residing in the Wilaya of Tamanrasset admitted to hospital on 11 April 2022, with acute flaccid paralysis of both lower limbs
- Leptospirosis in Tanzania: **20 cases, 3 deaths** all cases amongst farmers at a temporal agricultural site

- Dengue fever in São Tomé and Príncipe: **854 cases and 1 death (CFR 0.1%)** from 15 April to 12 July 2022. The HD concerned are Água Grande, Mézochi, Lobata, Cantagalo, Lemba, Caeu and the Autonomous Region of Príncipe.
- Yellow fever in Chad: **48 cases, 07 deaths (CFR 14.6%)** reported between May 2021 and 30 June 2022, in southern and central Chad.

- Marburg VD in Ghana: **2 cases, 2 deaths** from the Ashanti region reported on the 28/06
- Undiagnosed disease in Nigeria: **10 cases, 1 death** reported from a secondary school in Ika, (North east). Suspected etiology is petroleum poisoning while investigations are ongoing. Manifests as generalized seizures.

Risk Analysis : Importation of marburg virus disease

- Hemorragic fever due to a virus of the filoviride family.
- Classified as a high risk biosafety threat , can be transmited via contact with fruit bats and all body fluids from a patient.
- No treatment or vaccine available
- Incubation 2-21 days and very high case fatality rate



National Alerts: Highlights



Yellow Fever

➤ Week 29

- No cases reported ;
- No positive cases reported;

➤ Week 1 - 29

- **949** suspected cases compared to **747** in the same period in 2021
- 6 regions concerned (Adamaoua, East, North, North West, South, West)
- No deaths were recorded;
- **80%** of the cases are aged 15 years and above, and **53.3%** of the cases are male
- **53.3%** of positive cases are non-vaccinated and 6.7% have an unknown vaccination status

- **7 deaths recorded:** South West (3), Far North (1), East (3),

Acute flaccid paralysis

➤ Week 29

- **01 case reported ;**
- No confirmed cases

➤ Week 1 - 29

- 460 cases were investigated against 435 in the same period in 2021, i.e. an increase of 5.74%.
- 21 districts have not notified any cases for 12 months
- CENTRE: 2; COAST: 1; NORTHWEST: 7; WEST: 2; SOUTH WEST: 8, EN: 1


Measles

- 193 cases investigated
- 01 new district in epidemic

Week 1 - 26

- 3,702 suspected cases
- 1,387 confirmed cases
- **28 deaths (CFR = 0.8%)**
- **1,248 (90%)** cases are under 10 years of age,
- **832 (60%)** cases are aged between 9 and 59 months.



DISTRIBUTION OF NEW CHOLERA CASES BY REGION AND BY EPIDEMIOLOGICAL WEEK











Data of BHP EW 29

- 14,677 passengers passed through the PSF, 11,505 tests were carried out and 25 positive cases of covid-19 notified. Timeliness = 48% and completeness = 62%.

20 positive cases at Air HBP:

- BHP at Douala International Airport (4), originating from Italy (1), Canada (1), Belgium (1);
- BHP of Yaoundé Nsimalen International Airport (16), coming from France(4), Togo(1), Belgium(1), Ethiopia(1), the USA(1), Nigeria(1), Italy(1), Senegal(1), Germany(1), Russia(1), Gabon(3).

02 positive cases at Maritime HBP:

- Ekondo-Titi(1) PSF, from Nigeria
- PAD(1) PSF, originating from Nigeria


04 positive cases at Terrestrial HBP:



NATIONAL CLIMATIC ALERT: Risks


